
Inauguration of the Seminar by Mr. Chaturbhuja Kar, The Hon'ble Principal of the Derabis College, Derabhis

**Abstract:** The decline in rice yields as a result of excessive chemical fertilizer (CF) inputs is a matter of great concern in rice-growing regions of Asia. In two-year's field experiments, the nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium (NPK) status, growth characteristics and yield of rice were examined by application of poultry manure (PM), cow manure (CM) and compost (CP). Organic fertilizers were applied as EMN (estimated mineralizable N) based on their total N content. Six treatments were assigned in a randomized complete block design: (1) no-N fertilizer (N<sub>0</sub>); (2) 50% CF (CF<sub>50</sub>); (3) 100% CF (CF<sub>100</sub>); (4) 50% CF + 50% EMN from (4) PM or (5) CM or (6) CP. Compared with CF<sub>100</sub>, the CF<sub>50</sub>-PM<sub>50</sub> (total N ≥ 4%) accumulated higher N, P and K content in leaf, sheath, panicle and seeds, resulting in greater growth and yield. The CF<sub>50</sub>-PM<sub>50</sub> increased yield by 8.69% and 9.70%, dry matter by 4.76% and 5.27% over CF<sub>100</sub> in both years. The continuous application of CF<sub>50</sub>-CM<sub>50</sub> (total N < 4%) and CF<sub>50</sub>-CP<sub>50</sub> (total N < 4%) treatments led to similar NPK contents but higher yields than those of CF<sub>100</sub> treatment in 2018. In conclusion, the organic fertilizer (total N ≥ 4%) with the EMN method enhances higher N availability in each year. Continuous application of organic fertilizer (total N < 4%) over two years effectively increased N availability in the second year. The 50% organic fertilizer (total N ≥ 4%) and 50% CF led to increased NPK availability and rice yields over the 100% CF treatment, reducing CF usage and leading for sustainable agriculture.

To fulfill the task of feeding the expanding global population, climate change adaptable crops must be developed. By inserting nucleic acid molecules produced by any method outside the cell into any virus, bacterial plasmid, or another vector system to enable their incorporation into a host organism in which they do not naturally occur but in which they are capable of continued propagation, genetic modification refers to the creation of new combinations of heritable material. One of the most common and controversial results of modern biotechnology is genetically engineered organisms. Recombinant DNA technology progress had followed the emergence of genetic mechanisms and biological variability. Recombinant DNA is produced synthetically by combining two or more DNA molecules into a single molecule. By increasing yield and reducing reliance on chemical pesticides and herbicides, genetically modified foods have the potential to address many of the world's hunger and malnutrition issues as well as contribute to environmental conservation and maintenance. Genetically modified plants can help commercial agriculture overcome a number of present problems. 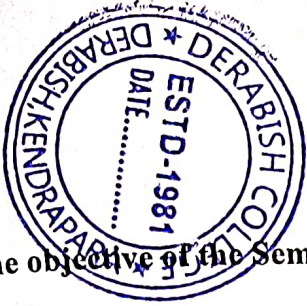
### About the College:

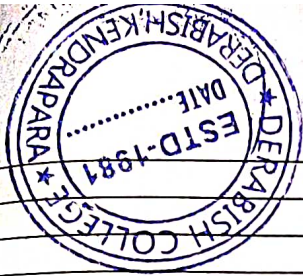

Status of Emergence and molecular evolution of Artemisinin Combination Therapy (ACTs) resistant alleles in *Plasmodium falciparum* malaria in India

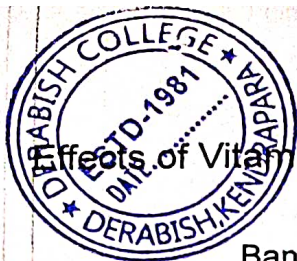

Advancement and multiply of malaria parasite *Plasmodium falciparum* capable of escaping antimalarials are the key alarm to malaria control. The currently efficient drug, artemisinin (ART), is under risk due to recognition of ART-resistant *P. falciparum* parasites in the Southeast Asian countries. It has been revealed that amino acid (AA) mutations at the *P. falciparum Kelch13 (Pfk13)* gene provide resistance to ART. Odisha and the other states of North-Eastern India, cross-bordering Bhutan, Bangladesh, Myanmar (South-East Asian countries) is highly endemic to malaria, contributing quite extensively to malaria, and resistance to chloroquine (CQ) and sulfadoxine-pyrimethamine (SP) combination drugs has already been reported in some parts of NEastern states. Since artemisinin combined therapy (ACT) is the first-line drug for treatment of uncomplicated malaria in Odisha and occurrence of low frequency non-synonymous amino acid mutations (F446I, A578S, K189T, G533A, S549Y, R561H, G625R, R539T) in certain regions of North-Eastern India which put in danger the eradication programme. We performed molecular surveillance for mutations (following PCR and DNA sequence analyses) in this gene from different areas of Odisha. Statistical analyses of DNA sequences were also performed following different evolutionary models. None of the different validated and candidate AA mutations of *Pfk13* gene conferring resistance to ART could be detected in *P. falciparum* sampled in the state of Odisha. In addition, DNA sequencing and sequence analyses indicated neither evolutionary selection pressure on the *Pfk13* gene nor association of mutations in *Pfk13* gene with mutations of other three genes conferring resistance to CQ and SP. After sequence alignment with the 3D7 reference sequence, all samples were found to be wild type. The non-availability of novel K13 mutations (neither validated nor candidate) associated with ART resistance malaria parasites, suggested no risk for the Artemisinin Combination Therapy (ACT), in Odisha.

Effects of Vitamin C on the hematological and biochemical parameters of Swiss albino mice.

Abstract

Vitamin C is an essential dietary supplement that plays a vital role in battling health conditions. The antioxidant has positive effects on the functioning of the body. The purpose of this study is to investigate the outcome of varying concentrations of Vitamin C on the hematological and biochemical parameters of Swiss Albino mice. Four albino mice were separated and accommodated in similar caging conditions. Three of them were orally administered with 250mg/kg, 500mg/kg and 1000mg/kg vitamin c powder, along with their diet. The fourth one was kept as control, in order to provide a standard value for future comparison. After 30 days of administration of the Vitamin C, the red blood cell count, the white blood cell count, the hemoglobin concentration, the platelet cell count and the packed cell volume of the blood samples were tested. The protein concentration, the cholesterol concentration and the albumin concentration and the glucose concentration, that comprises the biochemical characteristics of the blood, were also analyzed.

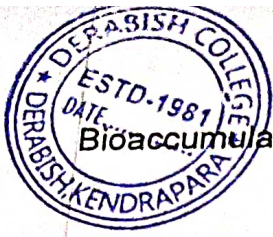
## APOPTOSIS: The Programmed Cell Death

### Abstract

The process of programmed cell death, or apoptosis, is generally characterized by distinct morphological characteristics and energy-dependent biochemical mechanisms. Apoptosis is considered a vital component of various processes including normal cell turnover, proper development and functioning of the immune system, hormone-dependent atrophy, embryonic development and chemical-induced cell death. Inappropriate apoptosis (either too little or too much) is a factor in many human conditions including neurodegenerative diseases, ischemic damage, autoimmune disorders and many types of cancer. The ability to modulate the life or death of a cell is recognized for its immense therapeutic potential. Therefore, research continues to focus on the elucidation and analysis of the cell cycle machinery and signaling pathways that control cell cycle arrest and apoptosis. To that end, the field of apoptosis research has been moving forward at an alarmingly rapid rate. Although many of the key apoptotic proteins have been identified, the molecular mechanisms of action or inaction of these proteins remain to be elucidated. The goal of this review is to provide a general overview of current knowledge on the process of apoptosis including morphology, biochemistry, the role of apoptosis in health and disease, detection methods, as well as a discussion of potential alternative forms of apoptosis.

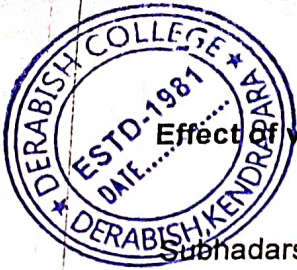

#### ABSTRACT

Kolab river is one of the major rivers of Odisha, India. Its source is at Sinkaran hills of eastern Ghats in Koraput district. The reservoir is popularly known as Kolab river. It is a major reservoir for irrigation project and electricity power house. Local fishes of Kolab river is largely consumed by the people of undivided koraput district. In the present study, the impact of different heavy metals on fish *Punctius ticto* was investigated. This study aimed to assess heavy metal concentration and their bioaccumulation status in commercially edible fishes. This is also aimed for the evaluation of human health risk for local consumers. The river Kolab has been one of the major recipients of industrial effluents in koraput district of Odisha state. The present study revealed accumulation of heavy metals Cu, Mn, Fe, Zn, Ce, Eu in *Punctius ticto* and the presence of Mn, Fe, Sn, P in river water. These output concentrations are higher than the standard limits. So, the presence of heavy metals in river Kolab increases or produces in toxicity on different organs of fish or fishes. After the entire investigation process the presence of heavy metals i.e. Cu, Zn, Mn, Fe, Ce found in the commonly consumed fish *Punctius ticto* and in the water of river Kolab as well. Biotic organism of river ecosystem may come across with bioaccumulation of heavy metals that can put adverse consequences on human and livestock.

**Abstract**

Aquaculture is known as the largest sector for production of foods. It is playing an important role in providing nutrition throughout the year. Blood parameters are very much sensitive to any changes in environmental factors that made easier to analyses. Haematological parameters are the well-known catalogues which have been chosen as the most important guide to identifying the health status of living organism. Blood parameters are very much sensitive to any changes in environmental factors. The main objective of this study is to provide baseline data of the blood profile of two teleost fish species living in different habitats. These two species namely *Parastromateus niger* (Bloch, 1795) and *Mugil cephalus* (Linnaeus, 1758) were taken for the experimental analysis. Haematological parameters were analysed by standard protocol. These parameters like white blood cells (WBC), red blood cells (RBC), packed Cell Volume are statistically significant at  $P < 0.001$ . The value of haemoglobin and mean corpuscular haemoglobin concentration (MCHC) value show statistically non-significant at  $P > 0.05$ . These assessments of haematological parameters will show the influence of habitat on physiological status of a species.

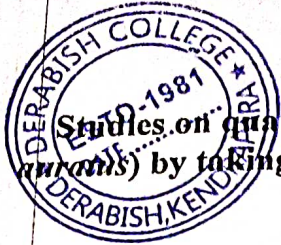

**Abstract**

The age of Indian major carp *Catla catla*, *Labeo rohita*, *Cirrihinus mrigala* minor carp *Cirrihinus reba* and snakehead *Ophiocephalus striatus* was determined by scale analysis method. Different length parameters were measured and length-weight comparison was also done. Scale analysis method was found to be the most suitable method for estimating age. Growth rate of *Catla catla* was found to be faster than that of *Cirrihinus reba*. The age group was divided as 0+ and 1+ for below 1yr of age and more than 1yr of age respectively. No significant variation was seen, rather the samples were found similar with each other. No adverse environmental impact was found on any species. The intra-specific and inter-specific correlation and ANOVA results indicate a +ve relationship among the species.

## Temperature and Storage period modulate the egg quality

### Abstract

White leghorn eggs contains a rich protein, vitamins, minerals and fatty acids and offering a great nutritional value. It is liked by the people of all ages. Eggs are liable to perish and can use it's quality rapidly during the period between storage and consumption. The main characteristics of egg quality are thick albumen height, yolk height, yolk index, albumen index, shape index and Haugh unit egg weight loss. The aim of the present study was to analyse the egg quality characteristics of eggs stored at different temperature. A sample of 100 eggs were obtained from laying white leghorn hens purchased from Central Poultry Development Organization (CPDO) farm located at Jaydev Vihar, Bhubaneswar. All hens were kept under same feeding and management condition. All eggs were collected within 4-5 days of their lay and were randomly divided into four treatment that is control (fresh), refrigerator (4<sup>o</sup>c), room temperature (22<sup>o</sup>c) and high temperature (31<sup>o</sup>c). 10 eggs were used for each treatment and were analysed for changes in the external and internal egg quality traits like egg weight, yolk index, albumen index, shape index, Haugh unit after 7, 14 and 21 days of storage. Egg weight of eggs stored in refrigerator at 4<sup>o</sup>c were found to be significantly lower ( $P < 0.05$ ) than the egg stored at room temperature and high temperature. From refrigerator, room temperature and high temperature, the egg weight ranged from (54.77g to 51.27g), albumen height (0.71cm to 0.41cm), yolk height (1.41cm to 1.01cm) and Haugh unit (85.69% to 64.08%) which decreases with the increase storage time. Thus in refrigerator egg quality was recorded better than those other condition. All the fresh egg and refrigerated egg gave significant value indicating minimal loss in quality. All the results indicates the egg stored at 4<sup>o</sup>c are better in terms of quality as compared to egg stored at room and high temperature throughout 21 days of storage.

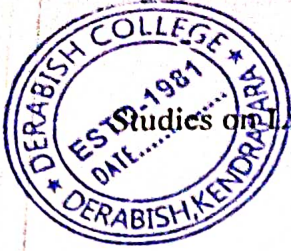

Samples were collected on a monthly basis from November, 2019 to February, 2020 at Paradeep. Correlation between fish and physico-chemical parameters such as total rainfall, atmospheric temperature, water temperature, pH, salinity, dissolved oxygen (DO), nitrate, phosphate and silicate were performed. 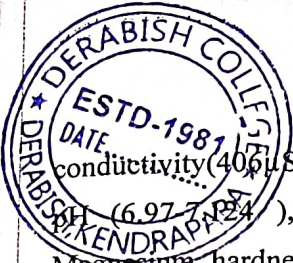

### ABSTRACT

Limnology is related to the study of fresh water ecosystem as well as their physical, chemical, geological and biological aspects of that ecosystem. Bramhani pond spread over nearly about two hectares of area at the centre of Sundargarh town, Odisha, India. The study of different physico-chemical parameters were done for about five alternative days in the month of winter from 24<sup>th</sup> December, 2019 to 2<sup>nd</sup> January, 2020. For the study various parameters, the sampling of water from the different sites of pond at the morning time that is 9.00 AM. The analysis of water was carried out in laboratory using the standard method of APHA-AWWA-WEF, 1999, Abbasi, 1998 and by using the systronic water analyser – 371. The results of this study revealed that the physico-chemical parameters were slightly change. During the period of this study different parameters were determined that are atmospheric temperature, water temperature, colour, transparency, pH, conductivity, salinity, turbidity, total hardness, Magnesium hardness, Calcium hardness, BOD, COD, total dissolved solid, dissolved oxygen. Also study the biological species like zooplankton, fishes and birds. Correlation of the above different parameters can be obtained by simple linear regression equation of type  $Y=A+Bx$ . Due to different practises like increasing population, advance agriculture, presence of various contaminants and anthropogenic activities the water of the pond become highly polluted. Water is play a vital role in survival of human, plants, animals and microbes and also for the aquatic ecosystem surround it. Availability of good water also able to prevent the diseases and improve the water quality. This study gives idea about the present status of Bramhani pond and also determined the suitability of water for the irrigation, agriculture, fishery and mainly for drinking purpose. This present status determine by both quality and quantity of the different parameters of that pond. The value of this water is compare with WQI value and found that water of this pond is in moderate condition, suitable for various practices and quite unfit for the drinking purpose. #### Abstract

Reduce, recycle and reuse of the organic waste becomes a major issue in many cities of developing nations. Enormous production of organic wastes coupled with poor management system, results in a significant environmental degradation. In India at most of the religious places a huge amounts of biodegradable waste are generated which contains fruits, flower, food waste etc. The quantity of flower waste in India is 300 MT/day. Odisha is considered as one of the holy state of India. Jatni is nearere to the temple city of Bhubaneswar. Large amounts of flowers are used during functions, worships, ceremonies and festivals. The quantity of floral waste generated by few major temples of Jatni city was assessed for vermicompost. In present study different proportions of mixture of soil, cattle dung and floral wastes were taken and performed vermicomposting process using *Eudrilus eugeniae* (Kinberg, 1867) earth worm species. The study was designed with variation of these contents with different ratios. Soil was kept as control throughout the study. After Vermicomposting process analysis of various physical and chemical parameters was done. It was found that in ambient temperature 23 degree celcius, pH about 6.53 to 8.06 pH, 1.5-2mm size particle size, 55% moisture content, black colour odourless were analysed. Thus, vermicomposting of temple flower waste is an excellent and ecofriendly method to get valuable products which will lead to a healthier and waste free environment.

## ABSTRACT

A pond ecosystem is characterised by relatively quiet water and abundant vegetation. The present investigation was carried out in Sankara pond which is present in the heart of Sundargarh town, Odisha which is home to many water birds, local as well as migratory. Due to anthropogenic activities there is rapid degradation of water bodies which need to be restored. The study was carried out in winter season from 24<sup>th</sup> December, 2019 to 2<sup>nd</sup> January, 2020. Different physico-chemical parameters and biological parameters of water were analysed during this time interval. The value of most of the physico-chemical parameters of water are in desirable limit except the BOD (6mg/l) value which exceed the normal limit which indicates the enrichment of water due to the uncontrolled dumping of garbage, debris and sewage. The pH of the water was found to be between 6.87 to 9.05, the conductivity was between 344 to 470 $\mu$ S, the salinity was between 0.22 to 0.24ppt, the turbidity was between 1.55 to 2.33 NTU, the TDS was between 200ppm to 218ppm and the total hardness during the study period was 100mg/l, the calcium and magnesium value was 20.84 mg/l and 11.66 mg/l respectively. The water quality of the Sankara pond was moderate for aquatic organisms, for aquaculture and agricultural uses, though it is moderate for aquatic organisms it need to be restored because of the increase in BOD level.

## Macro economics instability in India-An overview



### **Abstract :**

It seems India is undergoing a major change during last four years. There was a time when the national income of the economy was heavily contributed by agricultural sector. This was followed by manufacturing sector. The contribution of service was the lowest. This data pertains to the beginning of Five Year Plans of India. The trend started contributing in the first two decades of the present century and tenth, eleventh and twelve five year plan. After the end of Twelfth Five Year Plan the convention of half decade based plan has been stopped. Moreover, railways budget has been merged with the main budget. In the monetary sector, a major reform took place in order to curb black money and fake currency. This harsh reform was demonetization in the monetary sector. This has affected the money market and the LM curve of the economy. The second reform was the fiscal sector reform. The major tax reform is in the name of implementing goods and service tax (GST) in the fiscal sector. This has affected the product market and hence the IS curve of the economy. In addition a major act came in the construction sector in terms of real estate regulation Act (RERA). This has affected the construction sector which predominates in terms of employment in the tertiary sector. The purpose of this paper is to examine impact of sectoral reform on macroeconomic variables. The study is based on secondary sources of data published by government agencies. The study reaches to the conclusion that the economy has been troubled with these three reforms. As a result there has been macroeconomic instability in the economy. The growth rate has declined, the unemployment rate has gone up, consumption has also reduced, inflation rate has not sky rocketed. The sustainability of the economy has been badly shaken.

In a male dominated society like India, violation against women are unfortunately increasing at an alarming rate, such violence can be two types (a) Violence against women within the family (b) Violence against women outside the family including criminal violence. Violation taking place inside family is known as "Domestic violence" it refers to a pattern of violent abusive and coercive behaviour through which one member tries to gain power and control over other person inside the family. It includes crime such as dowry related harassment including death. Wife battering marital rape sexual abuse of female children and women of one's own family deprivation of sufficient food to female members, abusing female servants of family and so on.


Forms of Domestic violence.

- (1) Physical Assaults-It include beating, Pushing, burning. It may take place frequently or infrequently. The survey found that 31% of married have experienced it. followed by emotional violence 13%
- (2) Psychosocial Assault-It includes isolation from family and friends verbal and emotional abuse, control on women's movement etc.
- (3) Sexual Assault-Enforcing the partner for sexual acts especially when such acts are unwanted or declined by the other partner.
- (4) Economic Abuse -Such as not providing money for maintain women or her providing food, clothes, medicine etc, forcibly taking away salary, income or wages etc.

Impact of Domestic Violence

- It results in serious injury or death as well as in chronic health problems
- Can affect mental health status of victims.
- It affects the mental health of children and threatens their stability
- It frequently results in Isolation which causes damages to family and friends surrounding the victim.
